

The Happy Wanderer (Val-de-ri, Val-de-ra) Friedrich Moeller

The Happy Wanderer is a popular song written shortly after World War II. It is often mistaken for a German folk song, but it is actually an original composition. On January 22,1954, the song entered the UK singles chart - only a top 12 at the time - for 26 non-consecutive weeks.

The *Hallelujah Chorus*, from Handel's *Messiah*, is one of the most well-known musical pieces from the baroque period. It is traditionally performed during the holidays. In many parts of the world, it is the accepted practice for the audience to stand for this section of the performance. Tradition has it that this originated at the Messiah's first performance in London. King George II stood up at the end of the Hallelujah Chorus, and the rest of the audience followed his lead.

Out of respect for our musicians and other audience members, we ask that you would enter and exit your seat only between selections. If possible, wait until the audience is applauding before moving. The only exception to this is if you need to remove a restless or crying child. Please turn cell phones off or to vibrate and refrain from texting during the performance.
